Setting At-Home Day Schedules

A base schedule for at-home days is essential for managing time and completing assignments on time. Incorporating at-school day **evenings** is especially important when students are involved in extracurricular activities. Take Monday evenings to review and discuss the Weekly Class Assignment Sheets with your students. See the attached Sample At-Home Day Schedules as a guide.

Parental Review of Weekly Class Assignment Sheets

Students may discourage their parents from reviewing the weekly class assignment sheets because they feel confident about managing the assignments. However, there is often information on the sheets that is specifically for parents' information. Please make it a point to carefully review these sheets each week to ensure you are up-to-date on things you need to know.

Planning for Major Assignment Due Dates

Panic over major assignments can be avoided with a little bit of planning! Most major assignment projects take several hours, and sometimes days, to complete. Start by discussing the entire scope of

the project with your student. Determine the key milestones for the project and plan them out up to the due date. Build in time for review and reflection of the project before it is turned in.

Communicating with Teachers

Teachers' contact information can be found in Canvas or in the School Directory in RenWeb. Do not hesitate to encourage your student to contact their teacher with questions about an assignment. Parents are also encouraged to communicate with teachers as your child's partner in education. Please be courteous about how late in the evenings you call or text a teacher and expect a response.


Utilizing Canvas

Canvas is the learning management system. It is the students' personal connection to each of the courses they are enrolled in. In Canvas, students will access all assignments, communicate with instructors, submit documents, view grades, and so much more.

Canvas will be your personal connection to each of the courses you or your students are enrolled in. In Canvas, you will access all assignments, communicate with instructors, submit documents, view grades, and engage in learning activities with just a click of a button.

Be sure to download the Canvas app onto your smartphones and tablets. **Elementary parents of students (K-5th)** and **Secondary students (6th-12th)** will download Canvas. **Secondary parents** will download Canvas Parent. Both Canvas and Canvas Parent will require the student's login and password to access the account.

Elementary parents (K-5th) and secondary students (6th-12th) will need to sign-in to Google by entering their famf.org gmail account as their username and entering the password they created when they activated their account. Once they are signed in, open up a new tab and enter famf.instructure.com. This should take them directly to the Faith Academy of Marble Falls Canvas page.

Tapping Grade Level Parents, Mentors and Academic Counselors

Acclimating to the Faith Academy university model can be challenging for new families, especially during the first semester of school. Our grade level parents, mentors, and academic counselors are here to help you and your student ramp up and thrive in the system. How Much Extracurricular Activity is Too Much?

The answer to this question is unique to every Faith Academy family. However, there are some indicators and symptoms that should prompt you and your student to carefully evaluate if you're at-home schedule is being compromised by extracurricular activity.

1. Is your student completing work after their normal bedtime on a regular basis?
2. Has the stress level for completing work on time consistently increased?
3. Is your student losing interest in their school work?
4. Does your student seem less concerned about making good grades?
5. Is there an increase in family disagreements over school work?

If the answer is yes to any of these questions, it's probably time to reconsider your student's commitment to excessive extracurricular activity.

Take Flight: A Comprehension Intervention for Students with Dyslexia

Take Flight: Comprehension Intervention for Students with Dyslexia is a two-year research based curriculum written by the staff of the Luke Waites Center for Dyslexia and Learning Disorders at Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children. Take Flight is multisensory and uses direct, explicit, systematic, and cumulative instruction. The two-year program is taught 4 days a week, 60 minutes per day and is designed for students 7 years and older. The classes will be limited to no more than six students in the group. Take Flight is a comprehensive Tier 3 intervention for students with dyslexia. The first group of Take Flight students graduated from the program in December 2015. Our second group completed Take Flight in May 2017. We formed a third group that began in January 2017 and two more groups started in August 2017. Kari Steward is a Licensed Dyslexia Therapist (LDT), Certified Academic Language Therapist (CALT), and a Quality Instructor In-Training with the Dyslexia Center of Austin. Ensuring Your Child Believes You Are for Them

Partnering with your child on their education may require you to take a firm leadership role in setting schedules, mandating completion dates, and saying "no" to social activities. When tension rises, it is essential that your child believes that you are for them and not against them. Here are some tips to help ensure your child knows you have their very best interest at heart:

1. Give them a big hug whether they want to hug back or not.
2. Speak positive and encouraging words in the midst of a negative situation.
3. Write notes of encouragement and place them in your student's folders and books.
4. Write on a sticky note "I AM FOR YOU! LOVE, MOM" and stick it on their bathroom mirror.
